## MINUTES OF THE FULL COLNEY HEATH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD IN THE VILLAGE HALL ON THURSDAY -9<sup>TH</sup> JUNE 2005

#### 1. APOLOGIES

There were apologies from Cllr Hall who was unwell

#### 2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST- ITEMS ON THE AGENDA

There were no specific declarations. The Clerk notes Cllr Henchley role as President of CHFC. He has a non pecuniary interest in matters-member accepted to abstain from voting on all matters connected with CHFC. Allowed- to remain, and offer viewpoint without suggesting of or bearing due influence to, on matters so debated.

#### 3. MINUTES

The minutes of the 7<sup>th</sup> April 2005 were approved and accepted as correct-Proposed by Cllr Henchley Seconded by Cllr Reeves
The minutes were signed by the Chairman as correct.

#### 4 MATTERS THE CHAIRMAN MAY BRING BEFORE THE COUNCIL

The new Chairman wished to firstly thank the fellow Councillors for his nomination and Chair position, he hoped that his year would see a continuation of the past good work of the outgoing Chair Cllr Crump who he thanked. He added that we had a presentation from RDS the Developer involved in the BT site at Smallford, he would adjourn the meeting when they arrived at 8pm to allow members of the public and Smallford Residents Association to give their views. There were also issues of trespass on the Common and a Court Order the Clerk will update under Urgent Business

It was also opportune to mention that he had been invited to judge the Tyttenhanger Sign competition on 5<sup>th</sup> June 05. Where the clear winner was Cllr Reeves, with his sign design for the village, that we will see later, he offered Council congratulations.

#### 4a DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL-R.D.S.Ltd ON THE BT SITE-SMALLFORD

The Chairman introduced Mr Roger Rippon and Mr Nigel Reed from BT Investments As BT were the owners of the 30 acre site there were issues of its future now it had become completely surplus to the technical requirements of the Company with new technology taking over the at other places within the company structure. The building of about 100 homes was being considered within the disposal of the land, including about 40% affordable homes. The developer had requested a presentation at a meeting of the Parish Council to offer their plans for members and public to see as a distinct

alternative to other possible future uses that were being looked at. They were in discussion with SACDC development control but as yet no decisions or Council debate had taken place. The land did have previous use and it was hoped that the proposal would fall into allowable areas within the Green Belt on several conditions. As yet however nothing was confirmed Mr Rippon added that they wished to work with the Parish Council and residents. He presented some graphic details on display boards showing the site, its detail and overall plans. They had identified certain needs in the area for additional housing, the plans for this particular site has a great deal of visual open space that would be handed to the District Council in a form of technical lease to ensure that GB open-ness for the future. The houses would be confined to a smaller part of the area with a considerable landscape and tree planting area beyond.

The Chairman opened the debate to Member's comments, Cllr Henchley said he was concerned that this would create wider development in the area and potentially link Hatfield Town and St Albans and we consequentially lose our identity as a village. Cllr Reeves wanted to know what the footprint difference was, and how was it being calculated, Mr Rippon admitted that it was more. Cllr Reeves responded that only roofed areas should be considered not field compounds, telegraph poles or other. The Chairman then briefly adjourned the meeting inviting members of the public to give their opinions, the access through a small lane; part of the original Oaklands Lane gave rise to similar comments from several residents. The traffic predictions were another issue with 300 car movements a day and exit onto a difficult junction at the mini roundabout on the A1057 The residents did not want future highway changes to take place at the end of this narrow lane just for the sake of housing development. The lane was just one and a half vehicles wide, the only entry and exit, the nearby pony field was all part of the rural scene, they did not want this triangle sacrificed. Cllr Crump said that this council would be keen to see this development deferred until the District Plan is published in 2007. Cllr Day said it had wider implications and grave considerable concerns with the other proposed developments at the Glinwell and Oaklands areas for some 800 homes, seeing this as almost a small town overall. Equally taking into account any other proposals as yet to come forward under the ODPM proposals being threatened for the South East Plan and again not known yet. Mr Jeff Lewis spoke on behalf of the residents association saying that pressure on the infrastructure of the area, the schools are full and these developments breed commuter belts not rural lifestyle that people chose to have by living in Smallford Village. In essence they did not want this development intruding in their chosen place to live; it was not wanted and would serve little to enhance the area. It was out on a limb. He agreed and could see very little benefit in fact the opposite, that the need to wait and see the District Plan proposals in 2007 at least. At this point the Chair Cllr Rump resumed and summed up by saying that the developer may wish to take note of the comments. He thanked Mr Rippon and Mr Reed for attending. We as a council would pass our feelings on to the district via our minutes and to County Councillors and other representations within the democratic principles, and also wait for any plans or future proposals being raised in debate in our planning committee. He also stated that if this came forward again we could offer the developer a short public display in a local place giving an opportunity to review any proposals and give our parish a wider opportunity to comment. Taking note of both developer and BT intentions to consult on residents opinions before any final building or site proposals are made to SACDC.

## 5. URGENT BUSINESS AND MATTERS ARISING

## 5.1 Colney Heath Common Trespasses on Common Land

The Clerk gave members an overview of the return intrusion by caravans owned by Messrs Robb & Daniels, with two touring vans parked on the opposite side as the previous on the Warren Track. This had taken place soon after the removal by crane of the previous mobile home on Tuesday 1st June. The mobile home was taken to a private land area within St Stephens Parish and caused disquiet. In short the removal was considered to be poorly executed leaving this council with a bill for £1000.00. Complaints have been received from parishioners to the office and also Councillors. Both Cllr Brazier and the Clerk have been putting pressure on SACDC to sort this matter out once and for all taking account of the fact we have a valid Court warrant with "A no return within 3 months condition". Other High Court judgements will come into effect in early July ordering removal of other structures at Coursers Road showing matters are probably connected with the need to remove vans from that site. Advice was sought on the legal issue with CHPC Solicitors, the warrant is held by SACDC and we would need to pursue this differently in an action, with high cost risk. The Clerk will keep the members informed, a letter has been sent to Mr Lovelady and Cllr Brazier intends to pressure the issue in committee at SACDC later this week. ## 5.2 Pre School-Treasure Tots a Parish Council & Community Partnership.

Cllr Corley gave her report, there was an Fund Raising day on 15<sup>th</sup> May good weather and all had a lot of fun with £230 made from the stalls and bouncy castle, with a great deal of thanks to the T/T Committee and Tracy Aplin. It was planned to have the AGM on the 14<sup>th</sup> June at 8pm along with an introduction and new parents day in the afternoon. (This AGM only has since this meeting been postponed to 12<sup>th</sup> July 2005) On that day the OFSTED report had arrived and the Clerk had given a copy to Karen Chittenden the Leader of Pre-School, and Cllr Corley. The outcome was good with satisfactory or better noted on all counts, in general a good report with positive results that will enhance the future of the Pre School. Members wished to pass thanks to the leader and staff for their hard work making the school a success

#### 5.3 Coursers Road

Cllr Brazier said the decision of the High Court remains for removal of caravans and other illegal buildings on the flood plain. (See various correspondence-SADC)

#### 5.4 Highfield Trust and Park

No further reports still the official opening was still expected to be announced later. Cllr Reeves added that three committees have been set up and two are yet to meet he had a diary date for the 12<sup>th</sup> July for his own attendance.

## 5.5 Lafarge-High Street Recreation Ground-Entrance & Access

The Clerk reported that we had a lease document requiring signature; the yearly fee had been reduced to £100 since the earlier advice from Ottaways was caution, and members declaring that we had title and or rights of passage. It was agreed to copy out this document to members, defer to July and re debate before signing. The Clerk will advise Lafarge of the delay.

#### 5.6 Crime Report

No report received, nor had any news of a PCSO yet, the local relay reports circulated mention distraction crime, with two persons especially to the elderly were prevalent. See other information page 12

#### 5.7 Transport local Busses (Colney Heath Transport Group)

Cllr Corley gave a report on the meeting with the Steering Committee on 7<sup>th</sup> June, a copy of that is attached for members. There is to be a trial period of 3 months with a dummy run on 24<sup>th</sup> June and a start on 1<sup>st</sup> July. The cost of each trip is about £2 and the funding of the hire £60 needs to be underwritten by CHPC. This is considered to be unlikely, other than for the dummy run. HCC Officer David Nielan is to donate £250 for the start up costs from his transport budget on receipt of a Parish Invoice. Volunteer drivers and couriers are required to add to two so far. Any member of the council who can spare a few hours to drive the bus or help with courier duties on the weekly trip. (Training given!) No special qualifications other than a clean licence. Cllr Henchley has agreed to volunteer as passenger on 24<sup>th</sup> to help with the training along with the Clerk and others to check the procedure for the start date. Booking can be made via the Parish Office, and the Clerk intends to use the dormant MAP account to create a separate note of monies for this trial period. (See report for other details) Copy of Transport Group Minutes to be circulated.

#### 5.8 Tyttenhanger Sign

Cllr Reeves was the clear winner and members offered their congratulations, the sign was explained by Cllr Reeves from the drawing with connections to the local historic manor houses-Tyttenhanger and Highfields. There association with Charles Morris Esq., the noted local benefactor and resident of the house. The Clerk is to arrange for copies and to meet with Cllr Reeves to decide the make up and construction choices to get costs and arrange and produce it. Suggestions were debated on the places or possible location most likely near telephone box or another suitable focal village site. Planning permission with fee will also be required to SACDC via the parish office.

## 5.9 Commons Stewardship (See 10.5)

The Clerk said he had applied for grants in May under a part of the stewardship scheme, the application was tight to the deadline having been poorly publicised and reprimanded in the national press. He also stated the contractor had been on Furze Field to flail the hawthorn, the result was quite good but he was keen to have him back in late July or early August for a second cut. The cost was around £180 per cut. Estimates will be called for the fencing and it was hoped to provide these to members in the September meeting. Other detail regarding the Stewardship was underway or in plan to be completed. Cllr Brazier was not able to comment, delayed at a meeting.

## 5.10 Vehicle Intrusion on to Colne Heath Common

The Clerk said we have the matter in hand there was no further news at this time, we have a proposal to hold a public meeting.

#### 5.11 Schools Appeals

Cllr Crump said he felt sure that all had been allocated places although some not in the first choice category. The matter is now removed from the agenda.

#### **6 SPECIAL AND NEW BUSINESS**

## 6.1 Smallford Landfill Site Methane Levels Monitoring

There was little to report, Cllr Crump had no comments and the Chair Cllr Rump suggested we move on but keeping the item on the agenda. He said that with a busy Agenda he would move on with other headings if there were no reports or business to debate at this Council Meeting

#### 6.2 Vital Villages Plan-Published November 04

Cllr Corley said this was mainly linked to the Transport issue now and the connection with the community bus already mentioned in 5.7.

#### 6.3 Youth Club

Councillor Brazier was not present at this stage and so the start of a youth session at Highfield could not be covered this time.

#### 6.4 Smallford Residents Association

The issue of BT site covered earlier by the presentation from the developer.

#### 7. FINANCE

The Clerk submitted the financial report and gave details of the current financial and expenditure position. The audit had been received for 2002-3 and this would need members approval in July meeting see item 7.2.

## 7.8 Insurance-Zurich Municipal -Re CHFC Ceiling Damage

The Clerk said there would be little point in continuing as the builder had failed to respond to splitting the invoice. Cllr Brazier had tried to assist without any success; the Clerk said it was past the date we could reasonably expect the insurers to accept.

## 7.9 Rating Demands-Village Hall & Parish Office

The Parish Council had agreed to fund the entire rate demand of the Village Hall which qualifies for 80% rebate under Charity status. The office rating is a separate issue but is commercially rated and will be paid half yearly.

#### 12 HIGH STREET RECREATION GROUNDS

## 12.1 Colney Heath Football Club

The issue is that between £12-16,500 needs to be provisioned for the Disabled Toilet, it was important to ratify and approve the spend allocation. We had past debated and examined the costs, regarding the choice down to just two builders. Timing was very important to the club, it was hoped that with members approval the builders could be engaged to start ASAP. We had engaged the services of a consultant who reported the cost base and basic requirements. Some of which cannot be done this time round due to the Parish Council commitments from the precept. As landlord we have obligations to meet the 2004 act. Funding by way of small amounts is expected from the Club in approaching the sports charities. Funds and grants from local council are dried up. Cllr Rump and Cllr Reeves suggested and agreed this be deferred to July Meeting.

#### 12.2 Tennis Court Report.

The problem of damage to the chain link fence continues, Cllr Brazier said the use of wire cutters to enter was the nuisance; he repaired the damage on several occasions.

#### 12.3 Lafarge Land Issues

Members agreed to defer to July; the lease needs a signature and approval, Clerk to copy members with the document ahead of next meeting. There was a suggestion that a working party meeting be convened prior to the next full council if possible.

## 14.1 Inspection Report & Play Equipment & Graffiti

Cllr Corley has applied for a Biffa Award, £16,000 to improve the area and recreation facilities, quotes obtained from Matta, Safe & Sound etc.
