Community Governance Review

During 2022, St Albans City and District Council will be conducting a community governance review of the whole district. The review will look at governance arrangements at parish council / town council level.

The purpose of the review is to ensure that community governance arrangements reflect local identities and interests and are effective and convenient for electors and elected representatives.

Community governance reviews may consider a variety of topics, including:

- whether to create a new parish / town council
- whether to alter parish / town council electoral arrangements (e.g. number of wards / number of councillors)
- whether to alter the boundary of an existing parish / town council
- whether to group a number of parishes together in a grouped parish council

The scheme offers councils the opportunity to show that they meet the standards set by the sector, assessed by their peers, and to put in place the conditions for continued improvement.

The scheme has been designed to provide the tools and encouragement to those councils at the beginning of their improvement journeys, as well as promoting and recognising councils that are at the cutting edge of the sector. It is only through the sector working together, to share best practice, drive up standards and supporting those who are committed to improving their offer to their communities that individual councils and the sector as a whole will reach its full potential.

Local councils must meet the criteria of the guidance that is in place at the date they submit their completed application form to their local accreditation panel.

Colney Heath Parish Council is an award-winning Parish Council that has attained 'Foundation' level status.



Meet the New Councillor

Tony Burns, Colney Heath Ward. I was brought up in Friern Barnet and went to school in Finchley; I subsequently studied in London and Leeds and also had periods working in Cambridge, Hereford and Trowbridge. I spent most of my working life in higher education, engaged for over 20 years in teaching and research in my specialist field of food safety. In the last 10 years before retirement I was in a cross-university role concerned with academic standards in higher education.

My family and I have lived in Colney Heath for over 40 years and together have been involved in numerous local activities. I was a member of the CHJMI Governing Body for about 10 years and chaired it for most of that time. As a family we are long-term members of the Twinning Association, having paid our first visit to Boissy-sous-St. Yon in 1988. My wife, who taught for many years in Hertfordshire schools, chaired the Association for several years and was also on the committee of the WI for a period. I am a long-term member of Colney Heath Football Club and currently lead the club's darts team.

Like most residents of Colney Heath, I am keen to see it retain as much of its character as possible. It is likely that there will be developments in the coming years, particularly in the rural areas of the parish, and the Parish Council will have an important role in resisting developments which threaten the identity and character of our area. As a Parish Councillor I will aim to play a full part in this and in all other issues which affect the interests of local residents.



Working to create a wilder Hertfordshire and Middlesex for everyone

If you would like to see Colney Heath become a little bit wilder, then we have good news! Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust, in partnership with St Albans City and District Council, has launched a pioneering project called Wilder St Albans.

Wilder St Albans aims to increase biodiversity – natural habitats and the species they support – across the District of St Albans. This is extremely timely. Globally and in Hertfordshire, wildlife and habitats are in decline and we simply need to make more space for wildlife to thrive. What we have now in terms of habitat is not enough to halt this decline.

At least 30% of our land and sea needs to be managed for wildlife and protected for nature's recovery by 2030. This is considered the bare minimum and we are far short of this now. The project's recent ecological audit has shown that only 16% of our land in the District is considered as natural or semi-natural.



But 30% is tangible, we can all apply it to wherever we are, whether it is in our parks, verges, school grounds, places of work or gardens. It is something that we can all work towards and Wilder St Albans is here to support everyone and anyone who wants to take action. If you are taking action right now, no matter how small the act is then you are already helping to create a Wilder St Albans.

So how good is your patch and how can you work towards that 30% target or more? Here are four things you could try.



Take action

There are so many ways we can make our homes, gardens and grounds wild and wonderful. You could start as local as you like and cut a hole in your garden fence to create a hedgehog highway or plant bee-friendly flowers in your window box. Create a meadow in your school grounds or support others to do something. Deciding what to do and how to do can be daunting so the Wilder St Albans web pages are crammed full of resources, toolkits and over 50 individual actions to choose from: hertswildlifetrust.org.uk/ wilderstalbans

New Eco Dog Stations

In an attempt to help address the issue of dog mess on the Common the Council is purchasing two Eco Dog Stations providing free bags for the collection of dog mess. The stations will be installed soon at the Warren Farm Track and Church Lane entrances to Colney Heath Common. We hope this will be additional encouragement for owners to pick up after their dogs and dispose of the waste in the dog poo bins provided.

The Rebel Business School

Do you want to set up your own business but have been put off by traditional business plans and startup loans?

The Rebel Business School have partnered with St Albans City & District Council and other Hertfordshire councils to offer a free live online course that helps people from all backgrounds and situations to become equipped with the tools and skillset to transform their business ideas into sales without intimidating business plans or risky start-up loans. The practical and interactive course runs from Monday 21st March – Friday 1st April between 10am – 3pm daily (Mon-Fri) and covers all of the topics needed to start a business, including sales, taxes and marketing.

For those who feel stuck or have a business idea that they are not sure will work, the course is a great move towards their first sale, building their confidence and getting their business idea off the ground in a debt-free way.

St Albans Old People's Trust is a small and friendly local charity. Our aim is to relieve need, hardship and distress for older people in St Albans District. Over the last 10 years the Trust has helped over 500 local residents by paying for various goods and services that, for all sorts of reasons, they couldn't afford to fund themselves.

Can I apply for help?

To be eligible to apply you must be 60 or over, in need, hardship or distress and live in St Albans District.

What information will I need to provide?

We have a simple application form, which we can help you to complete. We need to know about your general circumstances including your household income. We recognise that you may have savings or own your own home but be finding it hard to make ends meet or pay for a big item. Your information is always treated in the strictest confidence. What can the Trust pay for? Examples of what we can pay for:

- Household and Personal Items: bed, reclining chair, mobility aids, cooker, washing machine, fridge, warm clothing, glasses, dentures, supportive shoes.
- Services: regular cleaning, meals on wheels, care alarm.
- Grants of money: travelling expenses to hospital, gas or electricity bills.
- Small Home Repairs: repairing a leak, decoration of a room, replacement carpets.
- Boiler Servicing: annual service and small repairs.
- New Boiler: we partner with the Warmer Homes Scheme to each fund 50% towards a new boiler (eligibility criteria apply)

The Trust will not pay for items which your housing provider, Social Services or the NHS should pay for. We cannot pay for things like regular gardening or holidays. We do not pay for large scale building works or structural house repairs.

Can you help me increase my income?

We know that 1500 older people across the district are not claiming Pension Credit, and many more are missing out on Attendance Allowance and other benefits. We work closely with Citizen's Advice to help you to apply.

How does the Trust decide on my application?

Every application is considered on its own merits because we know that everyone's circumstances are different. We approve over 90% of applications and can usually get an answer within 10 days. As an independent charity we do not have to use the same strict criteria as the Council or the NHS. If we are unable to help, we will try to signpost you to other sources of support.

Home Library Service in Hertfordshire

Hertfordshire Libraries provides the Home Library Service delivering books to some of the most vulnerable and isolated people in the county. Many of our customers regard the service as a "lifeline," and value the regular collections of books which are tailored to their interests and delivered to them in their own home by a friendly and familiar face.

It is not just the selection and the delivery of books which our customers appreciate, but also the opportunity for important contact and a chat. This is something that customers look forward to and that volunteers find rewarding.

To help develop this service further, Hertfordshire Libraries have launched a Reading Friends scheme. This enables library staff or volunteers to have a telephone call with Home Library Service customers about their favourite books, television programme or any topic of interest. The initial response to these befriending telephone calls has been very positive and demonstrates the importance for this work to expand. The Home Library Service supports people who are unable to get to the library, for example those who:

- have a physical disability which prevents travelling to a library
- have a learning disability or mental health condition that makes it difficult to leave home alone
- are registered blind (severely sight impaired)
- are frail or in poor health which means they can't get to a library
- are a carer looking after someone affected by any of the above, and their caring responsibilities prevent them from getting to the library.


