- Regarding the minutes of the previous meeting Clemow noted Mike Rawlins is the NP PO not a Councillor and Tarmac had omitted to note they had agreed to set up an e-mail address to receive reports of HGVs driving through CH village.
- Pendock advised reports of HGVs through the village should be issued to his e-mail address Pendock, Mike <mike.pendock@tarmac.com>
 He confirmed they will take action but to do so they need the date, street location and vehicle registration. This can be in text or photographic form.
 Registration plate details of all vehicles entering the quarry are recorded.
- Pendock advised site investigations on the field north of Coursers Road adjacent to the Common indicated potential quarry deposits worth but there were currently no plans to quarry there.
- Pendock noted at the exit to the quarry site on Coursers Road there were four wheel wash bays. Tarmac consider the current facility adequate provided lorry drivers waited for the wheel wash cycle to be completed the mud on Coursers Road was mainly due to drivers impatience. Tarmac are incurring high costs on road sweeping. Howard noted the wheel wash facilities would be upgraded in 2024.
 - Tarmac are checking the s106 agreement which was supposed to provide c£90,000 for drainage and kerbing along to Coursers Road.
- Footpath Ridge FP008 through Coursers Farm will be diverted to the field edge temporarily as it traverses the next area to be quarried.
- Pendock noted Rupert Evershed of the bird club had raised concerns about commercial dog walkers in the nature reserve area disturbing birds and trees planted in front of the bird watching hide now matured and obscuring the view of the lake. Tarmac were considering what action to take.
